Hello, SESLIP members, my name is Julie Greer. I wanted to introduce myself as your regional coordinator for the National Centre for Family Hubs (NCFH). I am working with Local Authorities in the South East of England to support the development of Family Hubs to meet local need, keeping families at the heart of the transformation process.

Carly and I are working closely together to support Local Authorities in the South East to develop Family Hubs using the Early Intervention Foundation's Theory of Change, for example, and create Communities of Practice with other areas.

I am also the Policy and Practice Advisor: Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, for NCFH and I would be very happy to support you in thinking about how to meet the needs of children and young people within your Family Hubs. We are currently writing a module for the toolkit on SEND, so please let me know if there is a particular aspect of SEND that you would want included, or if you are doing some effective work to support families in which one or more children have SEND.
