#### **Funding announcement**

As you will be aware by now, the DfE have announced the 75 upper tier local authorities who are eligible to receive funding to 'transform Start for Life and Family Hub services', <a href="www.gov.uk/government/publications/family-hubs-and-start-for-life-package-methodology-for-pre-selecting-local-authorities">www.gov.uk/government/publications/family-hubs-and-start-for-life-package-methodology-for-pre-selecting-local-authorities</a>

With only 30% of LAs in the South East selected, the majority of LAs in the region will be deciding what this means for their family hub development. We already know that many LAs are committed to transforming the way they meet local need and the integration of services is part of this approach. For others, lessons learnt during Lockdowns in the pandemic, have given opportunities to widen virtual and digital options, for example. There is also scope for wider regional collaboration and sharing ways of effective working are all part of this. Whilst some of you are still waiting on the DfE's announcement of the Transformation Bid, we wanted you to know that Carly and Julie are here to support all our LAs, regardless of funding status and we really appreciate lots of you being in touch over the last couple of weeks.

# **NCFH SEND update:**

The latest module in the implementation toolkit is now online, <u>Putting Families with children with special educational needs and disabilities at the heart of family hub planning</u>.

This module has been written in co-production with parents, carers and young people with expertise from experience and those who have expertise by profession, from education and health.
