
IDACI

IDACI (Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index)

Throughout this report, various indicators are plotted against the IDACI score of the Local Authority. The most recent IDACI figures were produced in 2019 using mid-2015 population estimates. The IDACI score represents the percentage of dependent children (non-prisoners) aged 0–15 living in incomedeprived households.

Where the IDACI score for the South East is shown, this will have been re-calculated to include only those LA's who have provided data for the indicator shown. Therefore the South East IDACI score may vary throughout the report.

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
Expected rates based on IDACI (IDACI Expected)


Methodology

Once national data is published for the relevant indicator, the rate per (x)thousand population is calculated for each of the English Local Authorities that provided data. The rates per (x)000 are then plotted against the IDACI scores for each LA on an XY Scatterplot. A Linear trendline is then added to the scatterplot and it is the equation of this line that informs the IDACI expected values.

The equation of the line is in the format y = mx + c, where m is the gradient and c is the height at which the line crosses the y-axis, also known as the y-intercept. To calculate the IDACI Expected rate we take the equation from the trendline and substitute the LA's IDACI score for m in order to return the relevant Rate, based on where the IDACI score meets the line.

The R² figure gives an indication of how well the trendline fits the data. The closer the R² figure is to 1, the better the fit. As you can see in the charts below, the R² figure for IDACI vs. Referral Rate (0.17) is far lower than for IDACI vs. LAC Rate (0.40), indicating that there is a stronger correlation between IDACI and LAC, than for IDACI and Referral.





Alternatively, the m (slope), c (intercept) and R^2 values can be determined without plotting the data by using the =SLOPE(), =INTERCEPT() and =RSQ() formulas in Excel.

Proportion (%) of Referrals from each Source 2023-24 [RIIA20202-20212]



Proportion (%) of Referrals from each Source 2023-24











Proportion of Care leavers aged 19-21 who were 'In Touch' [SCB55]








Proportion of Care Leavers aged 19-21 in Suitable Accommodation [SCB56]








Proportion of Care Leavers aged 19-21 in Employment, Education or Training [SCB57]


